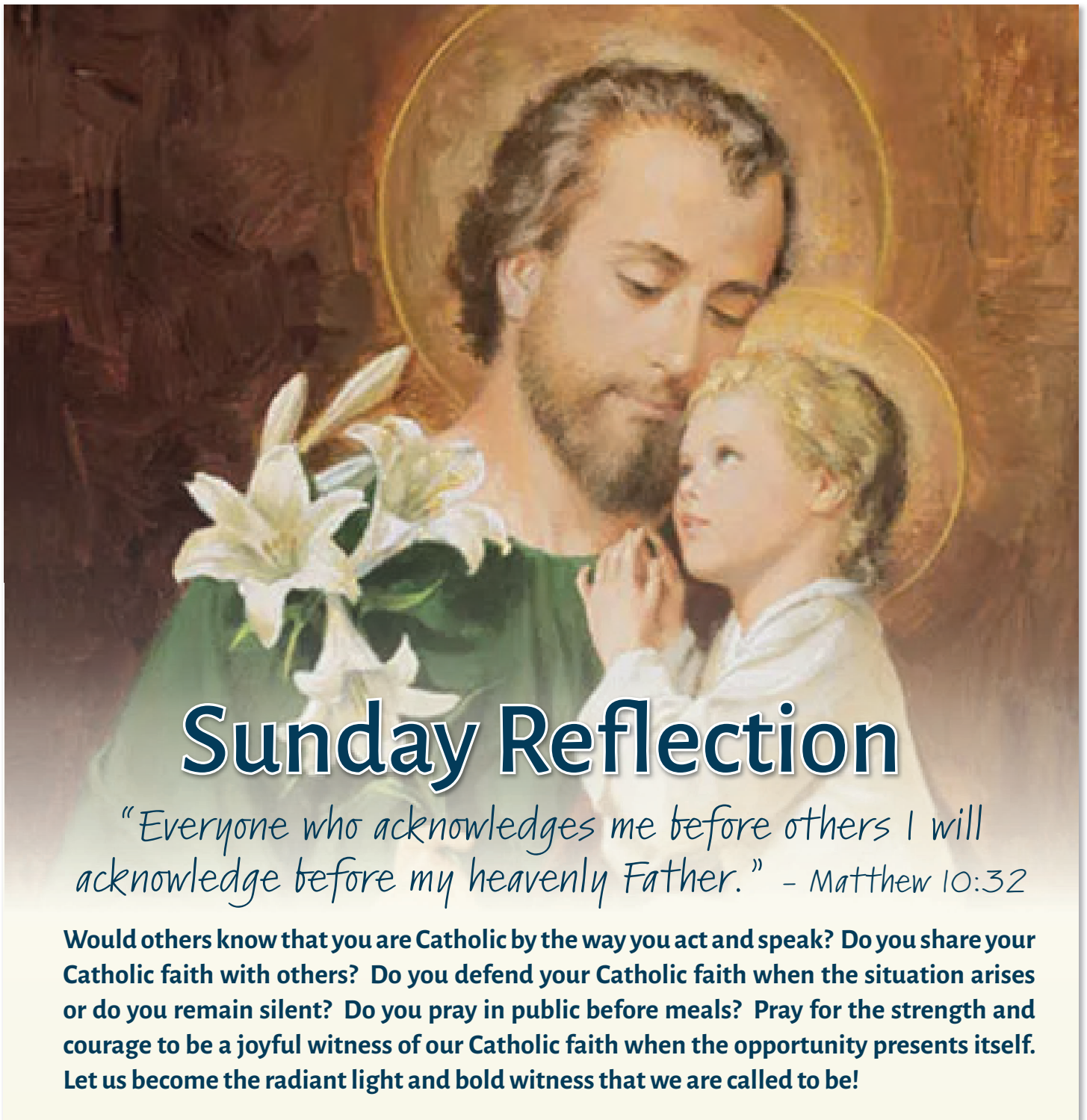

Phase 3 Resumption of Sunday Masses

Effective Sunday, June 21, 2020

As previously announced in the Cardinal's directives, and as depicted in the 'Welcome Back Video,' there will be many differences when returning to Church for Sunday Mass while continuing under pandemic restrictions. Each Parish Pastor will determine whether or not and when to return to a Sunday Mass Schedule and other Sacramental celebrations and the most practical schedule and way in doing so.

The Sunday Mass Schedule with which we will begin this next Phase, is included in this communication. Please be reminded of and take particular note of some important things:

- ✓ **Masks are required for entry into the Church.**
- ✓ **You should equip yourself with and use your own personal hand sanitizer.**
- ✓ **Follow all signage and directives in the Church, and from the Ushers and Staff.**
- ✓ **You will be directed to seating in both the Church proper AND the Lower Church. The 3 Masses will be 'beamed' down from the 'Upper' Church on a screen in the Lower Church, so that everyone is attending the same Mass.**

Because of the necessary limitations and reduction of seating capacity in the Church pews (alternate pews are closed off), family groups will first be accommodated in the Church, so as to make maximum use of the limited pew space. Then, individual seating will follow. As you will note, only 3 individuals OR a more numerous family group who live together are allowed in each of the open pews. If only individuals are seated in the Church, only 45 people can be accommodated. Hence, the need to defer to family groups first. With family groups primarily seated in the Church pews, conceivably up to 100 people could be accommodated.

The seating in the Lower Church, more easily spaced with folding chairs, is set up to accommodate 60 people. With everyone's cooperation, between the Upper and Lower Church, we will be able to accommodate the usual number of people who attend either of our Summer Sunday Masses.

- ➔ **Restrooms are not available.**
- ➔ **Hymnals/Missalettes have been removed from the pews and are not to be used at this time. You may bring/use your own Worship Aids to follow along in the Mass, and take them back home with you. Please do not leave anything in the Church.**
- ➔ **Please deposit your Collection Envelopes/Church Contributions in the Baskets/Collection Boxes stationed in the Aisles. There will be no Basket passing throughout the seating areas.**
- ➔ **For the receiving of Holy Communion, only ONE SINGLE LINE is to be formed in the center aisle. Please keep proper distance in coming out of your pews/chairs and while moving along in the Communion line. When approaching for Communion, you will receive the Sacred Host in your hand. Step aside, lift your mask, and consume the Host, then move along back to your seat **VIA THE SIDE AISLES.****
- ➔ **When departing the Church, please be conscious of keeping safe distances, alternating pews to leave safely. There cannot be social gatherings at this time.**

Thank you for your cooperation, patience, and understanding, as we continue on....

8 Things Every Catholic Dad Should Know About Fatherhood

Father's day is a day to celebrate the gift and importance of Dad's throughout the world. It is also a day for each one of us, especially men, to reflect on what it means to be a father, how we are called to live it, and to ask ourselves if we are living in the way that we should. As with any list or series of points, there can't be any pretension to exhaust the subject. However, I would like to present a few ideas that I think are fundamental to fatherhood.

8 Things Every Catholic Dad Should Know About Fatherhood

1. Encounter with God the Father: One can't give what he doesn't have. Many of us have been blessed with great fathers growing up (I include myself in this category) but other's haven't. In both cases, however, the source of Fatherhood must always come from above. Any man who seeks to be a good father, ignoring God the Father, will inevitably fall short. One must be aware that you aren't in control of your family, God is. Your leadership and service must be fruit of the obedience and humility that you live towards Him.

2. Conversion: A good father must be a converted man, or better yet, a man growing daily in conversion. Any man that abandons his efforts to live a Christian life, who doesn't allow the encounter with God the Father to transform him, abandons simultaneously the most fundamental testimony that he can give to his children. The encounter mentioned in the first point must be an effective one, you must grow, change, mature daily.

3. Man of Prayer: Conversion breathes prayer. Without it, it suffocates. If your schedule is too busy to allow time for prayer, change it.

4. Understanding your True Vocation: For those that are blessed to be married and have children, you must recognize that helping your families get to heaven and being good husbands and fathers – not your business career – is your real vocation. Ask yourself: “Is my work serving my family? Or is my family serving my work?”

5. Presence not presents: Fatherhood means presence. Presence is “being with”, “being for”. This implies that you invest

serious time with your family. And when I say serious time, I am referring to both quantity and quality. Have the courage to set the smartphone down and look your children in the eyes. Take a moment to marvel at who they are and who they are becoming. Look them in the eye, listen to them, speak to them about the things that matter. Share with them how you are doing, what's going on in your mind, in your heart, in your life. Share your “being” with them, not only what you have. Showering them with presents and fancy gifts is a poor substitute for face-to-face time; in fact, it isn't a substitute at all.

6. Courage: Have the courage to love according to the truth. The truth is that life isn't easy and neither is being a good Catholic. This means that you can't be a blend-in kind of father. Have the courage to correct, to teach, to demand, to challenge. And then have the courage to allow them to do the same to you.

7. Love your wife: Men, you must love and cherish your wives, plain and simple. Your children will learn to love others by how they see you and your wife love each other. The husband-wife relationship is their first school in love. It is the first lesson in community, in communication, in sacrifice, and in service. To love your wife means to offer your life for her, every day. “Husbands, love your wives, as Christ also loved the church, and delivered himself up for it.”

8. Be humble: In any relationship of service and authority, one quickly becomes aware of his or her own weaknesses. Don't be afraid, accept it with humility; it is perhaps one of the greatest displays of authority that exists.

As a complement to this commentary, I would suggest reading the following article written by Randy Hain. I took it as a general model for this post and shared his ideas in points 3, 4, and 7.

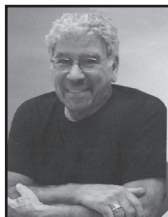
